WHERE DID OUR JHOW WILCOX ANCESTORS LIVE????

1.

John Carlos Wilcox married Violet Westwood in Mt. Pleasant in 1877.
In 1881 moved to Castle Dale.
Between 1884 and 1887 they moved to Moab. They were early settlers of Moab.
They had a ranch in La Sal.

2.

Mary Mehitable Wilcox married Herbert S. Day in Mt. Pleasant in 1877.
Herbert moved to Moab in 1879 being one of the first settlers.
In December 1892 he moved his wife to Moab.
He lived at the mouth of Mill Creek Canyon. They were the first settlers on Wilson Mesa. They lived a short time in La Sal and Blanding.

3.

Clarissa Jane Wilcox married Peter Christian Meiling in 1883 in Mt. Pleasant.
They lived on a 73 acre farm at Birch Creek, three miles north of Mt. Pleasant.
In 1903 they moved to Stirling, Alberta, Canada with several other Sanpete County residents. They lived there for about three years.
Approximately 1906 they purchased an 80 acre farm two miles southwest of Payson.
In 1919 they moved to Oak Creek, in Sanpete, Utah. They lived here one year.
Approximately 1920 they moved back to Payson. They lived there until 1944 when they moved to Provo.

4.

Sabra Ellen Wilcox married John L. Oliver in 1883 in Fairview, Utah.
After their marriage, they left Utah for Arizona.
Several years before they moved to Moab, Utah, they lived in San Juan County, New Mexico.
In 1913 they moved to Moab, Utah where they resided for the balance of their lives.

5.

Elizabeth Wilcox married Phillip Hurst in 1868 in Salt Lake City, Utah.
They moved to Colonia Dublan, Old Mexico in 1891 from Fairview, Sanpete, Utah.
In 1911 she moved to Colorado to live with her daughter, Luella Nielson.
In 1912 she moved to Grayson (later Blanding), Utah.

Hassard Wilcox married Catherine Matilda Wilcox in Mt. Pleasant, Utah in 1877.
Hassard came to Mt. Pleasant in 1860 with his parents and lived there his entire life.

7.

Sarah Wilcox married Thomas Wesley Bills in 1867 in Salt Lake City, Utah.
They lived in Milburn until 1920, when they moved to Mt. Pleasant where they resided.

8.

1875, James Henry Wilcox was one of the first settlers of Castle Valley.
In 1879 he staked a claim on 160 acres east of Castle Dale.
James Henry Wilcox married Harriet Ann Day in 1880 in Mt. Pleasant, Utah.
They moved to a log cabin in Castle Dale after their marriage.
1915 he moved to La Sal, Utah.
In 1933 at the age of 78 he moved to Moab.
He is buried in Castle Dale, Utah.

9.

Hannah Emeline Wilcox married Joseph Carl Carlston in 1885 in Logan, Utah.
1900 they are listed living in Eureka, Juab, Utah
1910 they are listed in Fairview, Sanpete, Utah
1920 they are listed in the census in Salt Lake City, Utah.
They are buried in the Fairview City Cemetery.

10.

Martha Anna Wilcox married Richard Dallin Westwood in Thistle, Sanpete, Utah in 1887. Their first home was in Mt. Pleasant, Utah.
They moved to Moab in 1889. They lived in an area called Dewey for about 14 years before moving into Moab.

11.

Justus Azel Wilcox married Selma Gustava Elizabeth Carlson in 1901 in Manti, Utah.
They lived in Manti for the first couple of years.
Approximately 1903 they moved to Stirling, Alberta, Canada as pioneers where they resided for the rest of their lives.
